FACILITIES PROJECTS

CCSD has submitted applications to the state for funding assistance for the following capital outlay projects that will take place beginning in Summer 2023. These projects will be completed over a five-year period. Projects per school are as follows:

- Cox Elementary updated HVAC system
- Funston Elementary- updated HVAC system
- Odom Elementary- new flooring
- Okapilco Elementary -updated HVAC
- R.B. Wright Elementary updated HVAC system and new paint
- Stringfellow Elementary -updated HVAC system

The next ESPLOST will be voted on in March 2023. If approved, the ESLOST will be in effect from 2023 until 2028. The Colquitt County Board of Education has identified several projects that will utilize ESPLOST funds should it be approved by voters.

Projects include construction and renovation for: Agriculture Facility and Canning Plant, Willie J. Williams Middle, Colquitt County High, and C..A. Gray Junior High.

SCHOOL SUPPLY SUPPLEMENT

Special Education teachers and paraprofessionals will begin receiving emails from ClassWallet letting them know they will receive a \$200 School Supply Supplement using Governor's Emergency Education Relief (GEER) funds.

As with the previous rounds of Governor's Classroom Grants, GaDOE will use ClassWallet – an online funds management platform – to streamline the distribution of the Governor's \$200 School Supply Supplements for Special Education teachers and paraprofessionals.
