Over the next year, the Colquitt County School District will embark on renewing its accreditation credential with COGNIA. COGNIA has updated the performance standards by which they support a school system's improvement over time through a peer review process.


- STANDARD 24- Leaders use data and input from a variety of sources to make decisions for learners' and staff members' growth and well-being.

Do you need to make a change in your tax deductions? Below are instructions on how to update and submit an IRS W4 and/or a Georgia G4 tax form:

- Login to <u>Frontline</u> Click on "Frontline Central" at the top left corner dropdown Click on "My Forms"
