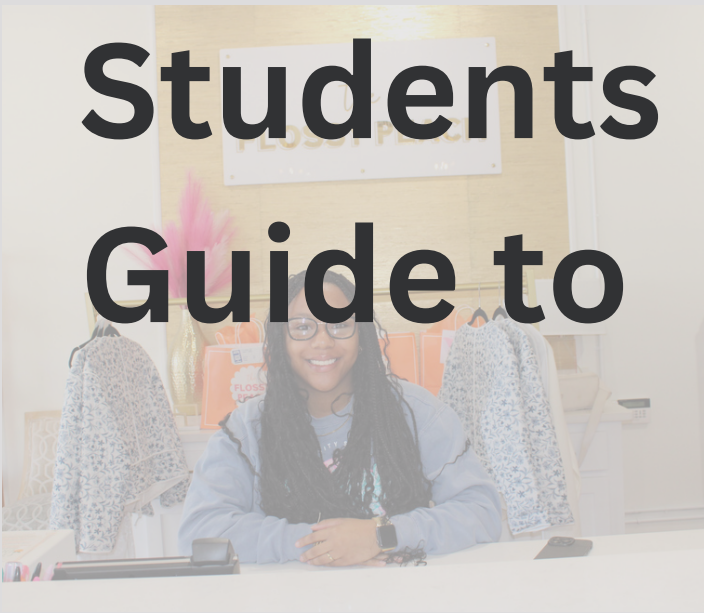

WHAT IS WBL?

Work-Based learning is an opportunity to be released from school early to go to work and start gaining real world experience and get school credit! You can have a paid part-time position or an unpaid internship. You can relate your work experience to your long-term career goals, but you can also get WBL credit if you have a general part time job.



CRITERIA

- Must be 16 years of age
- On track for graduation (passed all classes past year)
- No Disciplinary Action (We look back a year)
- Less than 10 unexcused absences per semester. (we look back a year)
- Completed a Pathway. (Class of 2026 and after)
- Passed the End of Pathway Exam. (Class of 2026 and after)



CLASS EXPECTATIONS:

- Monthly timesheet due at end of the month
- Join Google Classroom and complete the monthly assignment
- Report to work/internship everyday as scheduled.
- Sign up for Remind and have notifications on.
